

ANDY RODDICK HEADLINES WICHITA CHARITY TENNIS EVENT

Champions for Charity Benefits Medical Research, Community Fitness; Sponsored by MedAppz and Genesis Health Clubs

WICHITA, KANSAS – October 10, 2006 – MedAppz, the leader in web-based electronic health record (EHR) applications, and Genesis Health Clubs, a fitness chain currently celebrating its 20th anniversary serving the Wichita community, have joined together to bring US Open Finalist Andy Roddick and an all-star cast to town for the first annual Champions for Charity event on November 25th.

“I’m thrilled to be involved in the inaugural Champions for Charity event,” said Roddick. “It will be great to catch up with some old friends, play against some stellar competitors, and meet some Wichita youth who may well be the champions of tomorrow.”

Proceeds from the event benefit the Cerebral Palsy Research Foundation and the Genesis Foundation for Fitness and Tennis. Brenda Schultz-McCarthy, a former top ten WTA player returning to tennis after recovering from a back injury, was a key catalyst in putting together the Champions for Charity event. Her primary financial sponsor is MedAppz, and Brenda wanted to thank both MedAppz and Wichita by bringing Andy Roddick to town for a charity benefit.

“Both MedAppz and Genesis Health Clubs are committed to serving the Wichita community with a combination of fun, health, and inspiration,” said Jay Feist, owner of MedAppz. “This is a spectacular launch for our inaugural event, and we look forward to this becoming a continued annual celebration.”

The day will consist of many great events for all to see and talk to Brenda, Andy, and friends. A Kid’s Tennis Clinic and Serving Contest starts at noon, with a fund-raising dinner and auction at 5:00 p.m. An autograph session is scheduled at 6:00 p.m. with the main event beginning at 7:00 p.m. The format for the main event will consist of:

- **Doubles** – Mixed doubles featuring former top 10 Women’s Tennis Association player Brenda Schultz-McCarthy and Natasha Zvereva, a former # 1 women’s doubles player.
- **Doubles** – Roddick/M. Jensen vs. Fish/L. Jensen in a spirited doubles match.
- **Singles** – Roddick vs. Fish – a battle between two of the most powerful serves in tennis.

Andy Roddick, currently ranked No. 6 in the world, comes to Wichita off the heels of a finals appearance at the 2006 U.S. Open. In 2003 Roddick won the US Open title on his way to becoming the youngest American to finish the season # 1 in the history of the ATP rankings.

Mardy Fish, a 2004 Olympic Silver Medalist, Fish claimed his second career title in Houston in 2006. After battling wrist injuries in 2005, Fish has climbed over 250 ranking spots in less than seven months.

Luke & Murphy Jensen defined “Rock n’ Roll” tennis in the 90’s with their wild on-court antics and wardrobe. The pinnacle of their career as a doubles tandem came when they won the 1993 French Open double title and finished that year #5 in the world rankings for doubles. They both are current commentators for ESPN and The Tennis Channel.

Brenda Schultz-McCarthy, a former top ten WTA player, is a returning tennis champion who played in Wichita in 1986. After being sidelined for 4 years with a back injury, Brenda has returned to the circuit this year and regained her crown as the fastest serve on tour when she hit a 130 mph serve in Cincinnati (beating the previous record set by Venus Williams of 127 mph).

The event will take place on Saturday, November 25, 2006 at the Genesis Health Clubs location on North Rock Road. Seating capacity for the event is estimated at 3,000. More information on tickets and on-sale date are soon to follow. ■
